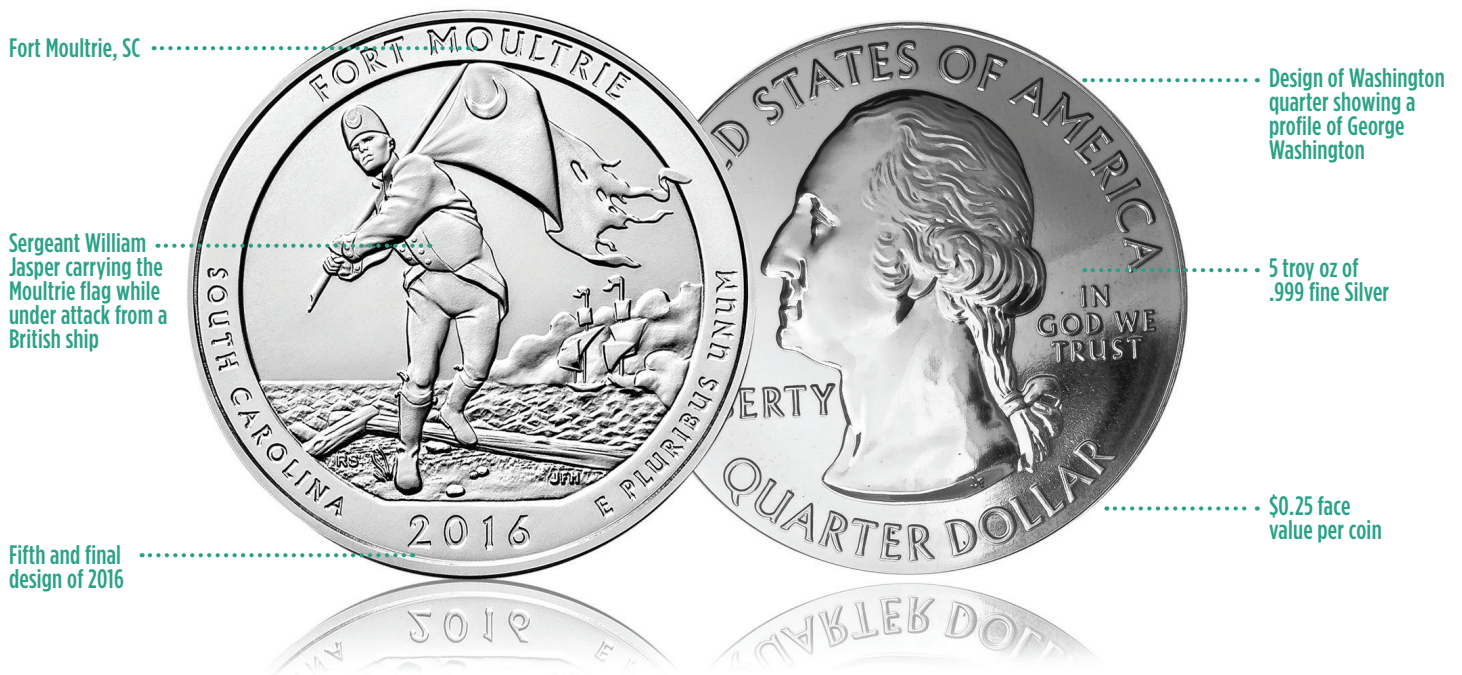


2016 5 oz Silver ATB Fort Moultrie National Monument, SC



On June 28, 1776, nine British warships attacked a fort near Charleston, South Carolina. Second South Carolina Regiment Commander William Moultrie led his 400 men in a day-long battle, eventually leading to the British ships retreating, heavily damaged. During the battle, Moultrie designed and flew his own flag, eventually known throughout the South as the Moultrie flag, or the Liberty flag.

The U.S. Mint began its America the Beautiful series in 2010, releasing a unique design for a national park, forest or monument in each state and U.S. territory. The 5 oz Silver coins have gained popularity over the years for their designs and limited mintages. Their premiums have consistently increased year over year as well, adding further collectible appeal to these .999 fine Silver coins.
