

2014 Gold Mexican Libertads



The Gold Libertad has been Mexico's treasured coin since its first minting in 1981. The obverse features an image of the Angel of Independence, or Winged Victory, statue, which has been one of the most recognizable landmarks in Mexico City since 1910. Also on the obverse are Popocatepetl and Iztaccíhuatl, two volcanoes that overlook the Valley of Mexico. These volcanoes tell a story of two lovers from warring families, similar to Romeo and Juliet. The volcanoes represent the warrior Iztaccíhuatl mourning the death of his beloved Popocatepetl.

Gold Libertads have extremely low mintages for bullion coins, adding collectibility to their .999 fine Gold bullion appeal. Also, featuring so much historic Mexican imagery, these coins are a great addition to any Gold coin collection. Gold Mexican Libertads are available in sizes from 1/20 oz up to 1 oz, providing options for any Gold budget.
