2016 1 oz Silver Mexican Libertad (MS-70 PCGS First Strike)



The Silver Libertad has been Mexico's treasured coin since its first minting in 1982. The obverse features an image of the Angel of Independence, or Winged Victory, statue, which has been one of the most recognizable landmarks in Mexico City since 1910. Also on the obverse are Popocatépetl and Iztaccíhuatl, two volcanoes that overlook the Valley of Mexico. These volcanoes tell a story of two lovers from warring families, similar to Romeo and Juliet. The volcanoes represent the warrior Iztaccíhuatl mourning the death of his beloved Popocatépetl.

Silver Libertads have extremely low mintages for bullion coins, adding collectibility to their .999 fine Silver bullion appeal. There have been less than 1 million 1 oz Silver Libertad coins produced each of the last four years, and that trend is expected to continue in 2016. This issue, not only in perfect MS-70 condition but also carrying the elusive First Strike label, is sure to be a collector's dream with a supremely low population expected.
