The Gold Libertad has been Mexico's treasured coin since its first minting in 1981. The reverse features an image of the Angel of Independence, or Winged Victory, statue, which has been one of the most recognizable landmarks in Mexico City since 1910. Also on the reverse are Popocatepetl and Iztaccíhuatl, two volcanoes that overlook the Valley of Mexico. These volcanoes tell a story of two lovers from warring families, similar to Romeo and Juliet. The volcanoes represent the warrior Iztaccíhuatl mourning the death of his beloved Popocatepetl.

Gold Libertads have extremely low mintages for bullion coins, adding collectibility to their .999 fine Gold bullion appeal. The 2017 1 oz Gold Libertad saw an extremely low mintage of just 900 coins. On top of that, PCGS lists only 139\* at this perfect MS-70 grade with the APMEXclusive® Green Label, which features an image of El Castillo in Chichen Itza. This is an ideal coin for collectors of the beloved Gold Libertad series.
